



## Travel with train to the Champions League final

Traveling from Vienna to Budapest by train for the Champions League final is straightforward, comfortable and the fastest option for international fans: direct Railjet and EuroCity services depart roughly every hour from Wien Hauptbahnhof to Budapest (typically arriving at Keleti or Kelenföld). The journey time is about 2 hours 30 minutes, and this long-distance trains include dining cars where you can buy meals, snacks and drinks during the trip.

These international trains run in cooperation between MÁV and ÖBB and provide reclining seats, generous luggage areas, power outlets on many carriages and onboard information in multiple languages, which makes the trip practical even for travellers who are new to Hungarian railways. Advance fares on some departures can start from approximately €13, but the cheapest tickets are limited in number and usually sell out for busy dates, so it pays to book as early as possible.

Purchase tickets through the official Hungarian ticket portal <https://jegy.mav.hu> [1] or with the MÁV mobile app, both of which accept international cards and deliver mobile or printable tickets that you can show on your phone. For a high-demand event such as the Champions League final, it is essential to add a seat reservation when you buy your ticket — a reservation guarantees a specific seat, helps keep groups together, and avoids the risk of standing on a crowded train.
