Assistance dog	A dog that has been or is being trained as a guide dog, hearing dog or service dog and is in service/in duty during the travel.

They may be supplemented by domestic tickets in foreign sales for connecting journeys to the departure point and from the destination point and linked to form a single (through) ticket. Interruption of journey	Any discontinuation of journey except for a transfer from one train to another successive train.
Issuing undertaking	Undertaking issuing a ticket and usually receiving payment. May be also the same legal entity acting as Carrier. The issuing undertaking is responsible for handling requests for refunds or delay compensations. The issuing undertaking is indicated on the ticket with its (RICS) code and, where appropriate, its logo or abbreviation. Usually, an undertaking responsible for stock control in case of paper tickets.
NRT [Non (integrated) reservation ticket]	Ticket without an integrated reservation valid on any (NRT) train of the same carriers serving the route marked on the ticket within a defined validity period. Reservations may (in some cases must) be purchased together with the ticket.
Offer	A product sold by an issuing undertaking for a specific tariff with defined conditions of use.
Online purchase/sale	Ordering tickets or purchase online including payment and creation of the ticket online.
Participant ticket	Paper or card document for members of a group travelling together.
Passenger	The person who intends to make, or is making, or has made a journey using the transport services and other services of one or more Carriers. May be different from the Customer

Single contract of carriage.	Contract of carriage which covers the carriage of the passenger from his/her departure to destination point represented by one or several tickets purchased within a single commercial transaction or within the scope of the options agreed by the carriers if the carriers' special conditions of carriage specifically provide for that.
Special Conditions of International Carriage (SCIC)	Conditions which carriers set down, individually or jointly, for certain international routes or for an international market union to supplement the general conditions of carriage GCC-CIV/PRR.
Standard Fare	The normal price without any reduction.

Term	Definition
Substitute carrier	A carrier who has not concluded the contract of carriage with the passenger but to whom the carrier has entrusted the execution of the rail carriage contract in total or in part. See Article 3b CIV. The substitute carrier is not liable in PRR cases. It is joint and severally liable together with the contractual carrier in cases of death and injury to passengers (Article 26 § 5 CIV) or for the transport of registered luggage - cars on auto trains included - (Article 39 § 4 CIV). Substitute carrier(s) is not shown on the ticket.
Successive carrier	Carrier in a chain of carriers who perform the contract of carriage with the passenger and who are liable for the performance of that contract. Successive carriers are shown with their 4-digit RICS codes on the tickets.
Supplementary ticket	Ticket which is issued in addition to the travel ticket(s) and which is used for change of class of travel, change of carrier, change of itinerary, supplements and boarding passes.
Tariff	System of fares with a specific pricing schema.
Through ticket	Single contract of carriage for successive railway services operated by one or more railway undertakings.
Ticket	Valid evidence, regardless of its form, of the conclusion of a contract of carriage.
Train category	The category of service and traffic operation of a train (e.g., regional trains, EuroCity, EuroNight, high-speed trains).
Travel agency	A legal entity which sells rail tickets in the name of and for the account of the carriers, possible in combination with other travel services.

1 Statutory basis for carriage

1.1 International traffic

Carriage is subject

- to the “Convention concerning International Carriage by Rail (COTIF) of 1999 and its Appendix A the “Uniform Rules concerning the Contract of International Carriage of Passengers by Rail (CIV)” as well as its Appendix C the “International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Rail (RID)”.
- in so far as it is applicable in the various countries and to the services in question, to Regulation (EU) 2021/782 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 29 April 2021 on rail passengers’ rights and obligations (PRR) including the CIV Uniform Rules in the version of Annex I to the PRR,
- to the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regards to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation).
- to the General Conditions of Carriage for Rail Passengers (GCC-CIV/PRR), to be found at <http://www.cit-rail.org/en>.
- to these Special Conditions of International Carriage (SCIC-NRT) together with the various carrier’s special conditions of carriage (these include common conditions of carriage for several modes (local transport operators consortium).
- to the law to which a carrier by sea is subject and to the special conditions he lays down for maritime sections in mixed rail/sea carriage.
- for international journeys for which a part of the route or the entire route is travelled with a bus, the carriage by bus is subject to Regulation (EC) No 181/2011 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 February 2011 concerning the rights of passengers in bus and coach transport. In so far as these SCIC-NRT conditions contain rules that benefit the traveller more, these are applied in addition.

1.2 Domestic traffic

Tickets for journeys between points within a single country which are issued outside that country, and which do not form part of an international journey, are subject:

- to the “Convention concerning International Carriage by Rail (COTIF) of 1999 and its Appendix A the “Uniform Rules concerning the Contract of International Carriage of Passengers by Rail (CIV)” as well as its Appendix C the “International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Rail (RID)”.
- in so far as it is applicable in the various countries and to the services in question, to Regulation (EU) 2021/782 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 29 April 2021 on rail passengers’ rights and obligations (PRR) including the CIV Uniform Rules in the version of Annex I to the PRR,
- to the Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regards to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation),
- to the national law applicable,
- to the General Conditions of Carriage for Rail Passengers (GCC-CIV/PRR) in so far as the carrier has declared he will apply them. To be found at cit-rail.org.
- to these SCIC-NRT and the contractual carrier’s conditions of carriage for domestic traffic, supplemented as appropriate.

The SCIC-NRT takes precedence over the domestic regulations for international and domestic tickets in foreign sales.

This document contains common conditions for participating Carriers. Each Carrier may define additional or different conditions as long as these Conditions are published and available to passengers.

2 Introduction and publication of the Special Conditions of International Carriage

Publication of details of the introduction, amendment or withdrawal of the Special Conditions of International Carriage is to be in accordance with the national law to which the participating carriers are subject.

3 Composition of the Special Conditions of International Carriage

This information comes as a reference to point 4.2 GCC-CIV/PRR.

The Special Conditions of International Carriage consist of the SCIC-NRT together with those special conditions of carriage of the participating carriers which depend on trains or offers.

4 Participating carriers

Appendix 1 to these SCIC-NRT shows the list of the carriers which participate in it together with their carrier codes and their addresses. The addresses of their customer service departments are available online at cit-rail.org

5 Issuing-of tickets

This information comes as a reference to-points 4 and 5.1 GCC-CIV/PRR.

5.1 In general

Tickets, through-tickets if appropriate, are issued for

- individual passengers,
- groups of passengers,
- dogs held by passengers,
- bicycles held by the passengers.

In principle, a separate ticket is issued for each passenger/dog/bicycle.

One ticket may be issued to several passengers travelling together. The number of passengers must be indicated on the ticket.

The tickets have to mention the exact fare name. In case of a standard fare, it is not necessary to mention the name.

Group tickets may be issued for a group of at least 6 passengers travelling together.

For groups, either

- a single group ticket and one participant ticket for every group member except for the group leader can be issued
- or
- an individual ticket can be issued for each group member.

Passengers with specific requirements may be required to make reservations for the corresponding additional services.

In function of the carriers' special conditions of carriage, and/or the offer and/or the sales channel, tickets are issued for named individuals or as impersonal tickets.

Return tickets are issued, with:

- outward and return journeys via the same route,
- outward and return journeys via different routes,
- return journey from a point different from the destination point of the outward journey,
- return journey to a point different from the departure point of the outward journey.

5.2 International tickets / through tickets

5.2.1 International (crossfrontier) tickets are issued for a journey of

- one carrier or successive carriers serving the passenger's route in at least two countries
- one or more carriers, up to / from the border point

The passenger may cover one or more parts of the international journey with other valid ticket/s, which is/are accepted accordingly by the carrier's Special Conditions.

5.2.2 If, in the case of No. 5.2.1 several tickets are sold in a single commercial transaction according to point 4.6 GCC-CIV/PRR they constitute a through ticket documenting a single contract of carriage. This applies to a combination of tickets issued under this SCIC-NRT as well as to a combination of tickets issued under this SCIC-NRT and other international tariffs (SCIC-IRT, SCIC-NT) and under a nationwide domestic tariff which is accepted as part of an international journey by the carrier's Special Conditions, if together, they cover the whole international journey of the passengers.

5.2.3 Exception: Deviating from No. 5.2.2, these tickets will not constitute a through ticket if

- a) the special conditions of the carriers involved state something different,
- b) the fact that the tickets represent separate contracts of carriage is mentioned on the tickets, or on another document or electronically in such a manner that allows the passenger to reproduce the information for future reference, and
- c) the passengers were informed of this prior to the purchase of the tickets.

5.3 Domestic tickets in foreign sales

Domestic tickets in foreign sales are issued for domestic routes in another country.

6 Purchase of tickets

6.1 Advance purchase

The advance purchase period is up to 12 months before the first day of validity.

The advance purchase period may be reduced or extended according to technical or commercial constraints (for example, change of timetable or for special offers).

Minimum and maximum time limits for advance purchase may apply to special offers and/or certain routes.

6.2 Offers which may only be sold via certain sales channels

Special conditions of carriage may apply to offers which are only available via certain sales channels.

Sales of tickets can be made through different sales channels, via the Carriers' points of sales, travel agencies or Distribution partners' points of sales.

The Carrier's sales conditions always take precedence over any Distribution partner's conditions (whether it is a different railway, a travel agency, etc.).

Payment must be made in accordance with the procedures permitted by the issuing undertaking.

Tickets can be issued in different forms:

the ticketing mode must always be chosen according to the Carrier's ticketing conditions and the Distribution partner's technical limitations.

6.3 Tickets

Tickets can be materialised

- as Paper-Ticket on secure paper,
- as Online-Ticket, printed on white A4-paper or shown on the screen of an electronic device (e.g., smartphone, tablet, pc) including a barcode, if it is readable during ticket control,
- as mobile ticket/digital code, shown in a booking application or on a screen of an electronic device (e.g., smartphone, tablet, pc) including a barcode, if it is readable during ticket control.

In any case, the conditions below are to apply.

6.3.1 For the booking and payment process the conditions of the Issuer apply.

6.3.2 Digital tickets are issued at least for one named individual as personal tickets.

Digital tickets for dogs or bicycles carry the name of the dog holder or the passenger who takes the bicycle along.

Digital tickets for groups carry the name of the group leader.

Digital tickets are not transferable. They are only valid in conjunction with an official Identity document with a photograph. The passenger with digital ticket must be the same as proven by the ID.

A single ticket which is valid for more than one passenger can be issued stating only the name of one of the passengers.

The terms of issuing and usage are given in the special conditions of carriage of the carrier.

6.4 Tickets for groups.

All details for Group Travel can be found under No. 12.4.

7 Period of validity of tickets

Tickets are in general valid 4 days including the first day of validity (for example 1st day of validity 01/04/year, last day of validity 04/04/year).

Nevertheless, issuing undertakings may issue tickets with a shorter period of validity in their special conditions of carriage.

As an exception, for issuer LTG Link and TCDD, the period of validity of tickets is 15 days.

On a bilateral basis, tickets with a longer validity can be issued.

Validity begins on the day shown on the ticket.

The ticket's first day of validity counts as a full day. Passengers may start their journeys on any day on which their ticket is valid at their discretion, but passengers must finish their journeys on a train which is timetabled to arrive at their destination point by 24.00 hours on the last day of validity.

The period of validity may be extended by maximum the validity period of the original ticket without charge if the ticket cannot be used within its period of validity for unavoidable reasons (illness, serious accident, etc.) The conditions of the carrier, to whom the request is made, are applicable.

Tickets for offers linked to specific trains are only valid on the date and in the train shown on the ticket.

8 Reservation and allocation of accommodation

This information comes as a reference to point 5.1.4 GCC-CIV/PRR.

A reservation guarantees a passenger accommodation. The carriers' special conditions of carriage lay down the conditions in which reservation is possible or, as appropriate, compulsory, and how

reservation tickets are to be issued. Timetables are to indicate trains for which reservation is compulsory.

Reservations shall be requested before the beginning of the journey. Accommodation is allocated in accordance with each carriers' conditions.

The Special Conditions of Night trains specifies the conditions for the reservation of couchettes and sleeper berths.

8.1 Reservation fee

The Issuer may make a charge for each reservation. The charge may depend on the class of travel, the category of service or the sales channel. See No. 12.2 for the use of whole compartments.

8.2 Use of the reservation

A reservation ticket will be issued for every reservation.

A reservation ticket is only valid with the associated travel ticket on the days, trains, carriages and seats indicated. Carriers may insist that a travel ticket is purchased at the same time as the reservation.

Accommodation is allocated in accordance with each carriers' conditions. Train staff may permit passengers without reservations to travel on trains with compulsory reservation if there is accommodation available.

In exceptional circumstances, train/carrier staff may allocate accommodation other than that shown on the reservation ticket.

Reserved accommodation is to be claimed within 15 minutes of departure from the station from which the reservation applies; if this is not done the entitlement to accommodation expires.

Passengers may indicate that an empty seat is occupied. Should passengers leave seats without a clear indication of occupation, they are to lose claim to them.

8.3 Exchange and refund

The conditions of exchange and refund are defined by the Issuer.

9 Use of tickets

This information comes as a reference to point 6.2 GCC-CIV/PRR.

9.1 Special rules

Special charges/supplements may apply to the use of certain trains or coaches (sleeping cars, couchette coaches, seated coaches, etc.).

Where there is a choice of route, the journey must be made by one of the routes shown. Changing during travel from one route to another route shown in the routing field is not permitted.

Outbound halves of return tickets become invalid after the inbound journey has started.

Carriers may require passengers to take specific actions prior to departure in order to consider tickets validated (e.g., stamping.) These conditions are to be mentioned in the Carrier's Special Conditions of Carriage.

Carrier	Condition
Trenitalia	Tickets issued by Trenitalia in Italy must be validated before the start of the journey. After having been date-stamped, these tickets are valid on Trenitalia trains for maximum of 4 hours.
Vy Gruppen (Vy Tog, SJ Norge, Go Ahead Nordic)	In Norway NRT tickets are allowed in 2. class only.

9.2 Passengers without valid ticket

For Passengers who cannot present a valid ticket during ticket inspection the “Special Conditions of Carriage” of the according carrier apply.

10 Interruption of journey

This information comes as a reference to point 6.2.5 GCC-CIV/PRR.

In principle, passengers may interrupt their journeys as often as they please without formality within the period of validity of the ticket.

The carriers’ special conditions of carriage may provide for exceptions for certain offers.

The period of validity is not extended to take account of interruption of journey.

Passengers may only resume their journeys at the point their journeys were interrupted or at a point further along the route they have not yet travelled.

11 Amendment of the contract of carriage

11.1 Change of route

In general, changing the routing of international and domestic tickets in foreign sales is permitted. Carriers may however prohibit changes of route in their conditions of carriage.

11.2 Change to a higher class of travel or to a higher class of train

In general, passengers holding international tickets and domestic tickets in foreign sales may change to a higher class of travel, a higher service category or to a higher class of train. A charge for this change may be applicable. Carriers may however prohibit changes to class of travel or to a higher class of train.

No extra charge will be raised if an accommodation in a higher class or category of service is allocated for reasons within the responsibility of the carrier.

If passengers have their allocated in a lower class or category of service, the train crew will certify that on the ticket, reservation ticket or on an appropriate receipt. The difference in price will be refunded in accordance with the carriers’ special conditions of carriage.

11.3 Change of carrier

In principle, where several carriers serve a section of route in parallel, passengers may not travel with a different Carrier than that indicated on their ticket. Individual carriers may permit change of carrier under special conditions; the details are then specified in their special conditions of carriage.

12 Offers

The carriers’ fares are based on a single journey in the classes of train, classes of travel and service categories they offer.

The principles governing reductions from these basic fares are laid down below. If, and under what conditions, carriers offer further reductions is laid down in their special conditions of carriage.

To provide the best applicable offer, the passengers might be required to indicate their age.

Issuers are to publish details of offers in accordance with the provisions of the applicable national law.

12.1 Calculation of fares

Fares are calculated on basis of the tariff valid on the day of issue of the ticket by adding together the fares for the various participating carriers' sections. The tariff currency is Euro (€).

The fare set by the carrier will be charged for single journeys.

For return journeys via the same route, twice the fare for the single journey will be charged, or if appropriate, a special fare set by the carrier for the complete return journey.

For return journeys via different routes:

- If the same carrier is used for the out- and inbound journey, the sum of the fares for the single journeys out- and inbound will be charged, provided there is no special fare for the complete return journey.
- If different carriers are used for the out- and inbound journey, the fare for each leg will be set by the carrier in question.

For return journeys where the inbound journey starts from a point different from the destination of the outbound journey or an inbound journey to a destination other than the departure point of the outbound journey, the sum of the single fares for each leg will be charged.

Individual carriers may apply special provisions for calculating fares for domestic tickets in foreign sales; these provisions are shown in the special conditions of carriage.

12.2 Particular fees

The fees and charges (local supplements, port taxes, etc.) shown in the special conditions of carriage of the various carriers will be added to the standard fares. Reductions allowed from standard fares (including reductions for children) do not apply to additional fees and charges subject to the carriers' special conditions of carriage providing otherwise.

Exclusive use of a whole compartment is permitted provided tickets and a reservation ticket are bought for all the accommodation in the compartment. Only the actual passengers may take advantage of the reductions they may be entitled to. The standard fare is to be paid for all the other accommodation in the compartment.

12.3 Reductions for children

The principles for reductions for children are set down below.

For the purposes of this provision, the criterion for the age of a child is its age on the day the journey has begun. The ticket held by the accompanying person is valid for the carriage of children free-of-charge unless mentioned otherwise under 12.3.1.

Children under the age mentioned in column 2 of the table in No. 12.3.1 (special conditions see under "Remarks" in No. 12.3.1) accompanied by an adult travel free of-charge, however if a seat reservation is wished or needed, this has to be paid.

Children between the ages mentioned in columns 2 and 3 of the table in No. 12.3.1 pay the standard fare of an adult with the carrier's reduction shown in the table below, column 6 (child fare).

Where appropriate, a seat reservation is issued under the same conditions as for adults.

In some countries special conditions may apply to children travelling alone as well as accompanied by another person.

12.3.1 Rules for children's age

Carriers apply the following age limits and reductions for child's fare. For children traveling alone, the most restrictive rule is applied when travelling with an international ticket. This also applies for the age of the child attendant.

12.4 Group travel

Groups can only be accepted for travel if the carrier is able to accommodate the group in timetabled trains, ship, or buses. Group travel might be subject to compulsory reservation.

A reduction for a group will be allowed if the reduced fare is paid for at least 6 persons.

The passengers forming the group must travel together in the same train, ship or bus for the whole journey.

Carriers reserve the right to withdraw the provisions of this section for specific periods of time or for certain trains, ship and buses.

12.4.1 Booking the tickets

Group tickets can be ordered and paid until the train departure provided the issuing undertaking has no special regulations. For the purchase of a group ticket the following information must be provided:

- the name of the group,
- the complete route, the date of departure,
- the total number of participants and
- the number of adults,
- the number and age of any children,
- the name of the group leader.

The group leader is responsible for observing the instructions given to him by the participating carriers, and for the behaviour of members of the group.

The applicant is responsible for the accuracy of the information given in the booking.

12.4.2 Reductions

The reductions for groups are given in the following table. The carriers' special conditions of carriage may provide for other reductions.

12.4.3 Child reductions

Children forming part of a group pay the reduced group fare of an adult with the carrier's reduction for children shown in the table of No. 12.3.1, column 6. The age limits for children shown in No. 12.3.1, columns 2 and 3 apply.

12.4.4 Exclusive use of a compartment

If the group requires the exclusive use of one or more compartments, the group ticket must be made out for the number of seats in the compartment(s).

12.4.5 Exchange and refund of group tickets

Carriers may impose restrictions in their special conditions of carriage.

12.5 Special trains, special coaches

It is possible to charter special trains or special coaches. Conditions and charges may be requested from the carriers. Appendix 2 shows the list of contact addresses for the carriers taking part in chartering of special trains or special coaches.

13 Exchange and refund

This information comes as a reference to point 5.2.5 GCC-CIV/PRR.

13.1 Exchange

Exchange may only be made within the period laid down by the carrier. Special regulations for exchange may apply to special offers.

As appropriate, a difference in fares may be refunded or charged to the passenger.

Exchange of digital tickets may only be made via the app, portal or as appropriate via the Issuer where it was purchased.

13.2 Refund

In principle, the fare for a ticket will be completely or partially refunded if the ticket is not used at all or is only partially used. Non-use or partial non-use must be confirmed on the ticket as of the first day of validity or until the time of departure according to the Carrier's conditions. If the ticket bears no confirmation of non-use or partial use, appropriate evidence may be required with the application for refund (medical statement, new ticket bought instead of the unused ticket, etc.)

Refund of digital tickets may only be made via the app, portal or as appropriate via the Issuer where it was purchased.

13.2.1 Submission and handling of applications for refund

The provisions of the GCC-CIV/PRR apply as regards submission and handling of applications for refund.

Applications for refunds are to be submitted to the issuing undertaking together with the original tickets at the latest one month after the validity of the ticket has expired. This period can be extended to three months, according to specifications in the SCIC of the issuing undertaking.

The requests themselves will be dealt with, in principle by the issuing undertaking, within a maximum period of three months after receiving the application and all the supporting documents from the passenger.

13.2.2 Handling fee

A fixed or variable amount may be withheld from the amount to be refunded. The amount of this fee will be set by the undertaking handling the refund.

14 Special conditions for hand luggage

This information comes as a reference to point 7.1 GCC-CIV/PRR.

Passengers may take easy-to-handle items as hand luggage with them. Passengers must be able to board and disembark the train in a single movement with all their luggage, without requiring external assistance.

The luggage must be placed either above or under the seat or in luggage racks in the coach. Seats must not be occupied by luggage. The luggage must not impact other passengers nor damage the train, and not restrict the free passage (corridor, doors). The special conditions of the carrier apply.

Bulky items (kick-scooter, skis, surfboards, musical instruments, prams, etc.) are only permitted if there is suitable space in the train to store them. As appropriate, they must be dismantled, folded or packaged.

Notice concerning the carriage of dangerous goods in passenger trains can be found in the Appendix 3.

Special exceptions of hand luggage carriage

15 Bicycles taken along by the passenger

This information comes as a reference to point 7.5 GCC-CIV/PRR.

The carriers' timetable documentation specifies the trains in which it is possible to take bicycles and if a reservation is required.

If bicycle racks are available, in principle bicycles may be taken. Bicycle racks are shown by pictograms on coaches, and, when available, by indicators on the platform.

Carriers may refuse to carry certain types of bicycles or allow folded bicycles only. For special regulations see table in 15.5.

15.1 Bicycle types

A passenger may take one bicycle on the train.

Only commercially available regular, assembled bicycles, consisting of a frame, two wheels, one saddle and a pair of pedals are allowed. This includes bicycles with auxiliary electric motors without required liability insurance. The battery must remain installed in the bicycle and shall not be charged onboard the train.

Other bicycle types, trailers or similar vehicles can only be taken if the special conditions of the carrier allow it.

15.2 Conditions for ticket and reservation

Passengers who take a bicycle along, must hold

- a. an international ticket for him-/herself and
- b. an international bicycle ticket for the same route, date, train and
- c. - if indicated in the timetable - a reservation of a dedicated bicycle space.

For the journey on which the bicycle is taken along the conditions of carriage of the carrier apply.

The bicycle fare is calculated from the NRT-fare of an adult with the carrier's reduction mentioned in the table below (column 4).

15.3 Provisions of journey with bicycle

Passengers load and unload their bicycle themselves. The loading is done without the luggage attached to the bicycle. For the luggage on a bicycle as well as for folded and/or packed bicycles the rules of hand luggage in No. 14 apply.

15.4 Liability for bicycles carried by the passenger

Carriers are only liable for accompanied bicycles in accordance with their liability for hand luggage (Article 33 – 35 CIV).

Passengers must therefore secure their bicycles to prevent damage and theft and if appropriate insure them.

The carrier accepts no liability for luggage which passengers leave on the bicycle. This also applies to accessories not permanently attached to the bicycle, such as water bottles, pumps, speedometers, computers, etc.

16 Taking dogs and small pets

This information comes as a reference to point 8 GCC-CIV/PRR.

16.1 General conditions

16.1.1 Passengers may take small and not dangerous pets as hand luggage if they are carried in species appropriate containers. The containers must be constructed that they cannot injure or damage people or property.

16.1.2 Passengers may take dogs which are not in containers, if they are on a leash and fitted with a suitable muzzle.

16.1.3 No other animal or animals with infectious diseases may be carried. Animals, except assistance dogs, may not be taken into coaches with catering installations. In addition, assistance dogs are excluded from the obligation to be muzzled.

16.2 Charges and special conditions

16.2.1 Small animals covered by No. 16.1.1 and assistance dogs will be carried free of charge. For assistance dogs, free tickets are issued on basis of No. 17.

16.2.2 A fare for dogs taken along without a container is calculated from the NRT-fare for adults with the carrier's reduction mentioned in the table below (column 2). Special supplements will not be charged. Whether further reductions are allowed is covered in the conditions of carriage for special offers. Accommodation will not be reserved for animals.

Carriers may exclude animals from specific class or coaches.

17 Special offer of carriage for persons with disabilities or persons with reduced mobility (PRM)

This information comes as a reference to point 14.2 GCC-CIV/PRR.

17.1 Beneficiaries

To benefit from the offer under No. 17.2 the following groups of passengers (Beneficiaries) are authorized:

- holders of a national registration card/PRM card (or an appropriate official document) being entitled to travel with an assistance dog or an accompanying person,
- holders of an EU Disability Card showing the letter “A”.

Beneficiaries under a) must carry his/her national registration card/PRM card (or the appropriate official document) and being able in a position to identify himself/ herself.

Beneficiaries under b) must be able to show the EU Disability Card during the travel.

17.2 Offer

Beneficiaries under No. 17.1 who pay the standard or a reduced fare for international journeys may be accompanied by an accompanying person and an assistance dog travelling free of charge.

The accompanying person/assistance dog must hold a zero price-ticket, showing the reason of the discount.

If the Beneficiary is a child and usually entitled to travel without ticket (see No. 12.3.1) this person has to buy a child ticket to be entitled to an accompanying person.

If required, the reservation fee for accompanying persons is obligatory as well as supplements for the use of certain coaches and/or trains.

17.3 Issue of ticket

International tickets and domestic tickets in foreign sales for Beneficiaries under **No. 17.1a)** as well as accompanying persons/assistance dogs shall be issued by a sales point in the country in which the national registration card/PRM card was issued under the national conditions for travels by train.

International tickets and domestic tickets in foreign sales for Beneficiaries under **No. 17.1b)** as well as accompanying persons/assistance dogs can be issued at sales points of any railway, that accept the EU Disability Card (see No. 17.5).

The free ticket for accompanying persons/assistance dogs can be issued only to the networks of participating railways (see No. 17.5).

17.4 Validity of the ticket

The ticket for the accompanying person/assistant dog is valid only for same service class and on the same route/coach/compartiment as the ticket of the Beneficiary.

Accompanying persons not travelling together with a Beneficiary are considered as a passenger without a valid ticket.

Points 10 and 11 GCC-CIV/PRR cover the entitlement of passengers to refunds, compensation and assistance in the event of train cancellation or delay in accordance with Articles 18 - 20 PRR 2021/782.

Compensation for delay for holders of Rail Pass tickets is covered in the SCIC RPT, published by Eurail B.V.

Notice concerning the carriage of dangerous goods in passenger trains (ad point 7.2 of the GCC-CIV/PRR)

Applicable with effect from 1 July 2019

This document may be shared with the public

In accordance with point 2.6 a) of the CIT Statutes, this document is a **recommendation** and only binds members to the extent that members adopt it (opting-in principle).

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This notice is intended to draw the attention of passengers to the restrictions on the carriage of dangerous goods as hand luggage or registered luggage, or in or on board vehicles (car on train).

The references to the complete set of applicable regulations may be found in subsection 1.1.3.8 of the annex of the Regulations concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Rail - RID (Appendix C to COTIF, see the OTIF website <http://otif.org>.)

Preamble

The dangerous goods covered by the Regulations concerning the International Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Rail (RID) are only permitted to be carried as hand or registered luggage, or in or on board vehicles under strict conditions and in very limited quantities. Goods regarded as dangerous include the following: gases, explosive substances and articles, flammable substances, solid desensitized explosives, substances liable to spontaneous combustion, self-reactive, oxidizing, toxic, infectious, radioactive, corrosive and environmentally hazardous substances.

1 Hand and registered luggage

- 1.1 Carriage of dangerous goods as hand and registered luggage is permitted only under the conditions specified in 1.1.3.8 of RID.
- 1.2 The dangerous goods permitted for carriage in a passenger's hand or registered luggage include dangerous goods packaged for retail sale and intended for personal or domestic use or for the passenger's sporting or leisure activities, provided that their packaging or nature prevents any leakage of contents, for example: matches, cigarette lighters, aerosols, gases contained in foodstuffs (mineral water, for example) or in balls intended for sports, light bulbs, cleaning agents, paints, resolvers, fireworks, insecticides, etc. *Such goods are also permitted if they were originally intended for one of the purposes mentioned above and are carried as waste (for example after use). The waste need not necessarily be packaged in the original packaging for retail sale, on condition that measures are taken to prevent any leakage of their contents under normal conditions of carriage¹.* Therapeutic equipment for the journey is permitted. Dangerous goods packed in limited or excepted quantities are also permitted provided all the applicable requirements are met.
- 1.3 Passengers are further permitted to carry electric energy storage and production systems (e.g. lithium batteries, fuel cells, electric capacitors, asymmetric capacitors, metal hydride storage systems), when they are contained in the equipment for personal use during the journey (e.g. laptop, cellular telephones). The carriage of bicycles with an electric motor (e-bike/pedelec) is also permitted.
- 1.4 Radioactive material is permitted when:
 - implanted or incorporated into a person or live animal for diagnosis or treatment;
 - present in or on a person carried for medical treatment;
 - contained in consumer products which have received regulatory approval.
- 1.5 Carriers may impose additional restrictions for carriage of dangerous goods as hand or registered luggage.

2 Carriage of dangerous goods in or on board vehicles (car on train)

- 2.1 The dangerous goods listed in [points 1.2 to 1.4](#) above may also be carried in or on board vehicles (car on train). The conditions mentioned in [point 1.1](#) also apply to dangerous goods carried in or on board vehicles.
- 2.2 The following requirements apply to vehicles:
 - Gases and liquid fuels (e.g. gasoline, diesel fuel, ethanol) contained in the fuel tanks of vehicles, machines or equipment are permitted for carriage. Any fuel cock between gas/fuel tank and engine shall be closed and the electric contact open.²
 - Liquid fuels may also be contained in refillable receptacles not exceeding 60 litres.

² This provision is fulfilled when the ignition key is withdrawn.

- Dangerous goods, such as batteries, fire extinguishers, compressed gas accumulators, airbags and other integral components of the vehicle that are necessary for the operation of the vehicle or for the safety of its operator or passengers, shall be securely installed in the vehicle.
- Lithium batteries installed in vehicles shall meet the requirements of RID. In the case of a damaged vehicle, the effects of the damage on the batteries shall be examined. If necessary, the batteries shall be removed and carried as dangerous goods in accordance with the regulations of RID.

- 2.3 Radioactive material is permitted for carriage when it forms an integral part of the means of transport.
- 2.4 Dangerous goods which are used for performing a professional activity (for example, aerosols, paints, solvents, gas cylinders carried by a manual worker or a sales representative) with the exception of internal or external distribution and of radioactive substances and articles may be carried subject to not exceeding the maximum quantities specified in RID and provided measures have been taken to prevent leakage of the contents. Uncleaned empty packaging from these goods may also be carried.
- 2.5 Carriers may impose additional restrictions for carriage of dangerous goods in or on board vehicles (car on train).

Info-Table

Provisions for Dangerous Goods carried by Passengers on Board of Trains*

In principle, dangerous goods (gases, explosive substances and articles, flammable substances, substances liable to spontaneous combustion, solid desensitized explosives, self-reactive, oxidizing, toxic, infectious, radioactive, corrosive and harmful and environmentally hazardous substances) are not permitted to be carried as hand or registered luggage, or in or on board vehicles (car on train). In the Table below examples of exceptions to this principle are given.

Permitted as hand or registered luggage		
	Permitted in or on board vehicles (car on train)	
YES	YES	Dangerous goods packed in limited or excepted quantities provided all the applicable requirements of Chapters 3.4 or 3.5 of RID are met.

The metal hydride storage systems shall be approved. The lithium batteries shall meet the requirements of RID 2.2.9.1.7.

YES	-	Radioactive material present in or on a person carried for medical treatment.
